Pray for these weekly needs:

Thursday: the church in our nation and world
Guidance for those who govern and those who are governed.
For peace and justice. Local, state, and national officials and servants.

Friday: AFA's own fellowship

For the growth and deep-rooted cultivation of unity and hospitality at AFA. For our pastor, board, and leadership team.

Saturday: the witness of Christians

That the church may grow inwardly in discipleship and outwardly through evangelism of the lost; All of our supported missionaries.

PRAYER TO THE CRUCIFIED CHRIST (ADAPTED) BY HOWARD THURMAN

Lord God, almighty and everlasting Father, you have brought us in safety to this new day: Preserve us with your mighty power, that we may not fall into sin, nor be overcome by adversity; and in all we do, direct us to the fulfilling of your purpose, through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.
